We adopt a theme-based approach, focusing on foundation building.

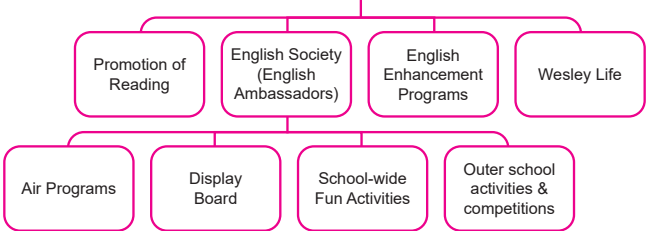
Senior (S4-6)
